Discipleship University Bible Reading Guide

Early Old Testament Foundations: Genesis 1-12

Put priority on reading for a spiritual experience. Always pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit and for a heart to conform to truth. Guide questions are to help the reader catch some of the key concepts and details.

Genesis 1 & 2: Both of these chapters are about creation, but they are very different.

- 1. Why are there two different accounts of creation? How are they different? Are these chapters consecutive or do they overlap?
- 2. Why is God's name different in chapter one ("God" up to 2:3) as compared to chapter two (LORD GOD)? How can you learn if this is an important shift made by the author?
- 3. Who was the author and to whom was he writing? What did he hope to achieve by writing Genesis?
- 4. What did God make on each day of creation?
- 5. What is the emphasis of the creation account in Genesis 2:4-25?
- 6. What doctrines are supported directly or indirectly by verses in these two chapters?
- 7. What evidence is found in this reading for the Godhead?
- 8. Was the Holy Spirit a participant in the creation of the earth?
- 9. What other places in the Bible put great emphasis on creation and the Creator?

- 1. Did the ark come to rest on one specific mountain called Ararat?
- 2. What was the first thing Noah did upon leaving the ark?

- 5. Which descendant of Ham was cursed? _____ Why should this be significant in future studies?
- 6. For how many years after the flood could people have learned personally from Noah?

- 8. What evidence is in chapter 12 (and previous chapters) that shows that the "ceremonial" system was already functioning before the Leviticus code was written for the "Jews"?
- 9. In what way could Abram's visit to Egypt be seen as prophetic?
