Discipleship University Bible Reading Guide

Early Old Testament Foundations: Genesis 13-27

For class to be held September 19, 2015

Put priority on reading for a spiritual experience. Always pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit and for a heart to conform to truth. Guide questions are to help the reader catch some of the key concepts and details.

Since we didn't get to Genesis 12 in our last class, it would be good to review the last reading guide for that part. Also, if you haven't read from *Patriarchs and Prophets*, I highly recommend chapters 1,7,8 & 9. Highly recommended chapters will be in bold type on the reading guide.

Genesis 13 & 14:

- 1. Why did Abram and Lot go their separate ways? Where did Lot choose to go and why?
- 2. Which of the 3 parts of the covenant of Gen. 12 did the LORD reemphasize to Abram after Lot left?
- 3. What was Abram's purpose in taking his small army to war against Chedorlaomer's coalition?
- 4. Do you think that Lot was a hindrance to the covenant Abram was attempting to keep with God?
- 5. Who was Melchizedek and why did Abram give him tithes?
- 6. Why did Abram refuse to accept the king of Sodom's suggestion that Abram keep all the goods that he had recovered in the battle?

Genesis 15:

1.	Who did Abram suggest to the LORD to be his heir to the covenant since he was childless?
2.	What special promises were given to Abram in this chapter?
3.	For what purpose did God ask Abram to do a multiple sacrifice (3 animals, 2 birds)?

- 4. What prophecy about Abram's descendants would surely catch the attention of the Israelite slaves in Egypt?
- 5. Who was being given 4 generations of probation before the LORD would give their land to Abram's descendants?
- 6. What were to be the boundaries of the promised land? Did Israel ever occupy all that land?

Genesis 16 & 17:

1.	What events showed a lack of faith by Sarai and Abram? Why did they think their plan was acceptable?
2.	Why would Hagar despise Sarai when she became pregnant?
3.	Who was the angel of the LORD and what did he share with Hagar?
4.	How old was Abram when Ishmael was born? What evidence is there that Abram and Sarai's lack
	of faith broke their covenant with God?
5.	How old was Abram when God renewed the covenant with him and changed his name to Abraham?
6.	What does Abraham mean?
7.	What became the sign of being in God's covenant?
8.	Of what significance was Sarai's name change? Who was to be heir to the covenant?

Genesis 18 & 19:

- 1. When Abraham first invites the 3 visitors to stay to eat, who does he think they are?
- 2. What made it scientifically impossible for Sarah to have a baby? (It's not her age.) ____
- 3. How do we know that one of the 3 visitors was actually God? Who were the other two?
- 4. How much regard did Lot have for his two youngest daughters?
- 5. What 3 points of evidence show that Lot and his wife were very reluctant to leave Sodom?

6.	Why did God save Lot? (see vs. 29) What two nations had their origins with Lot and his two daughters? Suggested Reading: PP chapter 12
