Early Old Testament Foundations: Job 28-42 & Exodus 1-4

For class to be held Nov. 7, 2015

Put priority on reading for a spiritual experience. Always pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit and for a heart to conform to truth. Guide questions are to help the reader catch some of the key concepts and details. It would be good to review Job 27 and 28.

3. What kind of person is described in Job 29:15-17?
4. What were the results of Job's words during his days of prosperity (Job 29:21, 22)?
5. What is the contrast between chapter 29 and 30?
6. Of what kind of sin does Job claim innocence in Job 31:1-12?
7. List the types of people that Job claims he never mistreated while he had power (Job 31:13-23).
8. In what specific ways does Job claim innocence from Job 31:24-28 and from verses 29-24?
9. As Job concludes his speech, what does he seem to want more than anything else?
Job 32-37: Speeches of the young man, Elihu.
1. What aroused the wrath of Elihu against Job?
2. What two things aroused the wrath of Elihu against Job's three friends?
3. In what verse in chapter 33 does Elihu sound arrogant or over confident?What verse in chapter
33 constitutes a challenge to Job to debate?
4. For what does Elihu find fault with Job In chapter 34?
5. What is probably the most important point Elihu makes about God in chapter 34?
6. What does Elihu conclude about Job in the last few verses of this chapter?
7. What is one key point that you get out of chapter 35?
8. In chapters 36 & 37, Elihu claims to speak great things on God's behalf. He talks of God's justice, power, control over nature. What specific points made do you think are his best or most impressive?
9. Overall, how would you asses Elihu's speech? Does he show more wisdom than Job's other three friends in your opinion? Why or why not?
