Discipleship University Bible Reading Guide Early Old Testament Foundations: Exodus 5-20

For class to be held Nov. 21, 2015

Put priority on reading for a spiritual experience. Always pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit and for a heart to conform to truth. Guide questions are to help the reader catch some of the key concepts and details.

Exodus 5-7

- 1. Since the Egyptians worshipped many gods, what is rather startling about Pharaoh's refusal in Ex. 5:2?
- 2. What is implied in verses 4, 5 and 8 of chapter 5? _____
- 3. Who was beaten when the Israelites couldn't make their quota of bricks?
- 4. In chapter 5, how does Moses fit into the chain of blame?
- 5. After God's explanation for his coming actions in Ex. 6:1-6, He concludes by saying, "I will redeem you with an outstretched arm and with great judgments." What does verse 7 give as the reason or purpose for these great judgments?
- 6. When God told Moses to go again to Pharaoh to request that Israel be allowed to go into the wilderness, what reason did Moses give for certainty that Pharaoh wouldn't listen?

Note: Ex. 6:14-27 appears to be a genealogical insert by Moses to make sure that future readers would understand the descendants of Levi, the priestly tribe, and Moses and Aaron's connection to them.

- 12. According to verse 22, what made Pharaoh's heart grow hard?
- 13. How many days passed before God sent Moses back to Pharaoh?
