STUDY GUIDE NO. 15

- Romans 6:23** The wages (or consequences of) sin is eternal death.
- Revelation 2:11** The consequences of sin is the second (eternal) death.
- John 5:28, 29** There are two resurrections – one to eternal life, the other to eternal destruction.
- Revelation 20:6** Blessed and holy is he that has part in the first resurrection.
- 1 Thessalonians 4:16** The righteous dead will rise at Christ's return.
- 1 John 5:12, 13** If you have the Son of God as your Savior then you have the promise of eternal life.
- Matthew 7:9-11** The Father is full of grace and kindness like Jesus and will never unjustly punish anything or anyone (see John 14:9).
- Ezekiel 33:11** God takes no pleasure in the death of the wicked.
- Isaiah 53:5, 6** Calvary tells us how much God loves us. Christ took our sins upon Himself (see 2 Corinthians 5:21).
- Matthew 27:46** On the cross Jesus felt abandoned, forsaken, and separated from His Father.
- Isaiah 59:2** In bearing our sin, Christ suffered the wages of our sin – eternal separation from His Father.
- Hebrews 13:5** What God promises never to do to us, He was willing to do to His Son so that we might be saved.
- Matthew 13:37-42** Hell fire takes place at the end of the world. No one is burning now.
- 2 Peter 3:10, 13** Hell fire does not burn forever because after the fire has done its job God will make all things new. Sin will be eradicated and the righteous will live here on the earth made new (see Matthew 5:5).
- Revelation 20:14, 15** At the end of the 1,000 years God will cleanse the earth with fire.
- Revelation 21:1** After the fire has done its job of purification, God makes a new heavens and a new earth.
- Matthew 25:41** The fire is prepared for the devil and his angels. None us need go there!
- Jude 1:7** Sodom and Gomorrah are examples of eternal fire. The consequences of the fire are eternal (see 2 Peter 2:6).
- Mark 9:43** Unquenchable fire refers to a fire that no one can put out until it goes out (see Jeremiah 17:27).

- Revelation 14:11** “Forever” is sometimes a relative term in the Bible. It can mean until a term or life is over (see Jonah 2:6; 1:17; 1 Samuel 1:22, 28).
- Malachi 4:1, 3** The purifying fires of the last days will burn up everything, root and branch.
- Ezekiel 28:18, 19** Hell fire will also destroy the devil and his imps. No more sin or Satan. They will not rise again.
