Romans 6:23	The wages of sin is eternal death.
Romans 3:20	While God's law reveals our sin it cannot get rid of our sin.
Hebrews 13:20, 21	The blood of the everlasting covenant alone can wash away our sin.
Hebrews 8:10-12	The new covenant promise is that God will write His law upon our hearts and our minds.
