Genres of the Bible

Prayer for the aid of the Holy Spirit is the most important principle for understanding the Bible. It is also helpful to recognize different genres because, for example, one shouldn't try to read poetry the same way narrative is read. It aids reading comprehension when the reader knows an approach that fits the genre.
