Panel Discussion and Questions for Central Study Hour

Quarter Review and Lesson 12, "The Work of the Holy Spirit

- Why is it so important to know that the Holy Spirit is the 3rd person of the Godhead and not simply a divine influence that comes from the Father or Jesus? (2 min) Michael

III. Lesson 12, The Work of the Holy Spirit

3. <u>Monday's Lesson</u>: John 16:8 said that the Comforter or Helper would not only convict us of sin, but He would also convict us of righteousness.

Question #4. Why do we need to be convicted of righteousness?

**Read Romans 5:10.

Question #5. How can we be saved by Christ's life as much or more than we are saved by His death on the cross? **(1-2 min)** Fred

**Read Hebrews 4:14-16.

Question #6. How does Christ's high priestly role in the sanctuary in heaven shed light on being convicted of righteousness? – Or -- What role does His righteousness have in His intercession for us? (2 min) Mike, (1 min) Michael

Question #7. For Thought: Is our righteousness really as filthy rags? Do we really believe this?
Just how much do we need Christ's righteousness? Does anyone want to comment?
(1 min) Mike

- 4. <u>Tuesday's Lesson</u>: John 16:8 said that the Comforter or Helper would also convict us of judgment. What is meant by that?
 ***Read John 16:11*.
 Question #8. What judgment is Jesus referring to here, and why is this such good news?

 Question #9. If Satan is a defeated foe, why does 1 Peter 5:8-9 warn us that the devil goes about as a roaring lion? (1 min) Mike
 Question #10. So, how can we "resist" the devil as it says in 1 Peter 5:9?
 (1-2 min each) Mike and Fred
- 5. <u>Wednesday's Lesson</u>: Should we ever say or feel that we are irrevocably saved? Question #11. Since we are capable of pushing aside the voice of the Holy Spirit to go our own way on any issue in life, how can we ever have assurance of salvation? (Each pastor answer using designated Scripture – 1-2 min each) Michael (1 John 5:12-13), Mike (Romans 8:15-17), Fred (2 Corinthians 5:5) Question #12. How is assurance different from presumption? (1 min each) Michael and Fred Question #13. On what must assurance be based? (1 min each) Fred and Mike The Bible talks of being sealed by the Holy Spirit. What does that mean? **Read Ephesians 1:13-14. Question #14. What does it mean to be sealed by the Holy Spirit? (1-2 min) Who wants to try to answer this????

Question #15. What is the connection between love and hope? (1 min) Michael We can see how Jesus dying for us gave us hope, but how is hope put within us? ***Read Romans 15:13* (our memory text).

Question #17. According to this verse, what effect does hope have on us? (30 sec) Mike
