I. <u>Introduction</u>:

V. <u>Monday's Lesson</u>: "A Servant Remnant"

- 1. What is the standard definition of the remnant in the Bible?
- 2. Why does that come up in a quarterly about justice and mercy shown to the poor?

Sum up/briefly tell the story of **Exodus 32:1-8** (Golden Calf Apostasy).

I think that we agree that God's people in Exodus behaved much differently from the remnant of Rev. 12:17 who obey God's commandments.

- 3. Was God really planning to destroy Israel and raise up a new chosen nation from the descendants of Moses or was he testing Moses' love for the wayward people?
- 4. If God offered to make a "great nation" from your children, grandchildren, and so on, to replace the lukewarm Seventh Day Adventist church, how tempting would that be for you? Would you have enough love for the people of this denomination to refuse as did Moses?
- 5. What made Moses boldly argue with God? What were His arguments with God for sticking with wayward Israel? (Answer both questions, but do not bring up verse 32 yet).

6. How does Moses' attitude in his prayer compare to the Remnant of Rev. 12:17?

- 7. Ask the question in the box at the bottom)
- VI. Tuesday's Lesson: "Reaching Souls"
 - 1. What are the two main ideas for winning souls, and why can this cause a problem?
 - 2. How is this problem resolved?

We are going to read a couple of verses about the witnessing power of good works.

- 3. What do Peter and Paul say about the witnessing power of good works done by God's people?
- VII. Wednesday's Lesson: "Grace Within the Church"

- ** Read Ephesians 2:19.
- 1. What do you think is included in the idea of describing the church community as the "household" of God? How should this description influence how the organized church operates?
- VIII. Thursday's Lesson: "Encourage Each Other to Good Works."

Even with a sincere heart, great effort, and faith in God, working for the Lord can be discouraging. Often people don't seem open to the truth, and there is a lot of pain and sorrow in our world. This is one reason that we need the church community. There is a lot of potential encouragement in the community of believers.

- 1. Hebrews 10:25 is the best known of these three verses; so, what do verses 23 and 24 add to our understanding of verse 25?
- 2. What are some ways in which we can encourage each other "toward love and good deeds"? Share highlights from the following paragraph if not covered ("In almost any task....").
- 3. What Bible verse urges us not to get tired of caring for people, especially when we see such little progress? (It's in the narrative.)

<u>Share</u> from the final paragraph ("This is why...").

<u>If time</u>: The Teacher's Comments shared an interesting idea called the "helper's high." Share what that is.
